School

Woodstream Christian Academy (WCA) is a K-12 classical Christian school that seeks to provide our students with a biblical worldview while offering a rigorous college preparatory education. As a classical Christian school, the Academy embraces the Trivium and has the following departments: Early Childhood Education (K2 – K4), the School of Grammar (K5 – Grade 6), the School of Logic (Grade 7 – Grade 8), and the School of Rhetoric (Grade 9 – Grade 12). Committed to academic and spiritual excellence, WCA exists as a community of learning that equips students spiritually, intellectually, emotionally, physically, and socially. Accepting families of varied socioeconomic, racial, and educational backgrounds, the Academy enrolls students with diverse learning styles and offers college preparatory instruction. The goal of the Academy is to develop students who have a lifelong commitment to intellectual and ethical excellence so that they may be effectual influences in the world in which we live.

History

Woodstream Christian Academy opened its doors on September 2, 2003, welcoming 54 students in K3 through K5. In September 2004, the Academy expanded to accommodate students in K2 through Grade 8. The Academy received students in Grade 9 at the beginning of the school's third year, thus marking the beginning of the School of Rhetoric. During the 2008-2009 school year, the Academy—whose enrollment reached over 400 students—received full accreditation by the Association of Christian Schools International and the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools for its academic program and graduated its first seniors, the Class of 2009. The Class of 2016 is the Academy's eighth graduating class.

Academic Program

Students have preselected grade-level course offerings for core courses, and the ability to select a limited number of electives and honors courses. Even though the Academy does not rank its students due to the small graduating class size, high academic achievement is recognized by the following honor distinctions: Cum Laude (3.1 – 3.39 grade point average), Magna Cum Laude (3.4 – 3.69 grade point average), and Summa Cum Laude (3.7 or higher grade point average).

Grading Scale

Each course within the School of Rhetoric is a college preparatory course that is weighted. Both Honors and Advanced Placement courses have a higher degree of difficulty and a higher degree of student responsibility. Grades earned in those classes are weighted higher than the college preparatory courses. The grading scale is as follows:

All courses taken at the Academy are College Preparatory except for Honors and Advanced Placement courses, which have more rigor. Students transferring into the School of Rhetoric will have their weighted letter grades converted to a non-weighted 4.0 scale.

COLLEGE PREPARATORY GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students earn credits for graduation only in Grades 9-12 unless prior approval has been granted by the Woodstream Christian Academy Leadership Team. Students are required to take a minimum of 32 credits for graduation, and they are expected to enroll in at least six major courses each semester unless the Academic Dean of the School of Rhetoric grants exemption.

Woodstream Christian Academy has partnered with Liberty University to provide students with an opportunity to enroll in college level courses. These course credits are transferrable to Liberty University or any other four-year college the student chooses to attend.
